- Design the perfect system upfront using generalised patterns
- Use configuration as code
- Things have the same Behaviours if they have the same Properties?

Traps

- lower testability
- No refactoring with any level of confidence
- Greater obscurity of meaning and behaviour





Traps

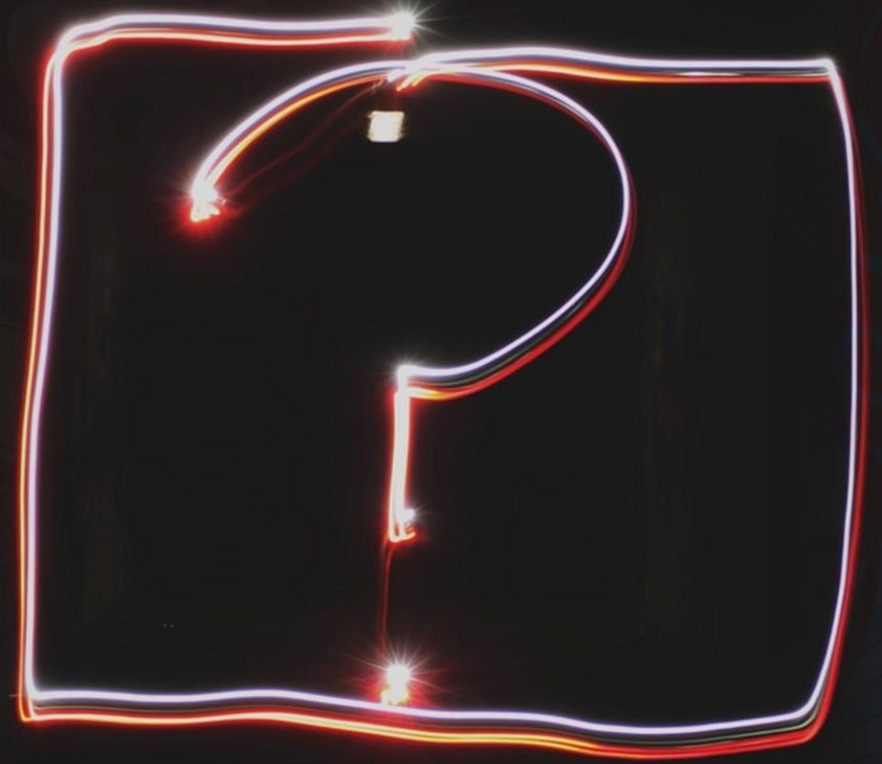
- Increased incidental complexity
- Overgeneralisation
- low IDE support and inferior tooling
