Mob Programming

- One of the central disciplines of TDD and Extreme Programing
- Brings the knowledge and expertise of the group to the task
- Encourages brainstorming refinements
- Provides fast feedback and ensures standards are met
- Allows continuous learning
- BUT some find it less natural and more of a challenge to work within a group than others – particularly those that tend towards an introvert nature

What is an introvert?

Q: How much does the average introvert weigh?
 A: Not enough to break the ice.

- Q: What is a group of introverts called?
 A: An oxymoron.
- Q: How do you spot an introvert in a crowd?
 A: You don't



Introversion is a personality type

- Introversion is a basic personality style characterized by a preference for the inner life of the mind over the outer world of other people.
- Introversion is at the opposite end of the scale to extroversion – most people will fit somewhere on the scale between the two. Many people will share traits with both.
- Introverts tend to turn to their own minds to recharge, while extroverts seek out other people for their energy needs.
- Introversion is not shyness. Those who are shy typically want to engage with others but are fearful of doing so. They are highly self-conscious and easily inhibited by others. Many introverts, on the other hand, socialize easily; they just strongly prefer to do so in very small groups or, sometimes, not at all.






Traits of an introvert

- Need time to themselves
- Socializing/interacting with others is draining
- Enjoy working alone
- Don't like to be the centre of attention
- Prefer a close circle of friends
- Think before talking
- Find it difficult to concisely express thoughts
- Prefer writing over talking
- Can become absorbed in thoughts and ideas



Introverts & Mobs

- Working in groups can be very draining
- Can take time to become comfortable with new people or situations
- Navigating puts them in the spotlight where they would naturally prefer not to be
- Typically not the best at thinking on their feet and like to think before speaking
- Tend to express themselves less forcefully
- May appear to be less engaged but in reality are engaged but just thinking or reasoning out ideas



How can we best accommodate introverts in the mob?

- Becoming familiar with how they think and express themselves and allow them the space to do so
- Take regular breaks don't skip them
- Don't interrupt or talk over them (or anyone)
- When they are navigating, don't go over their heads and tell the driver what to do directly
- Adhere to psychological safety: "a shared expectation held by members of a team that teammates will not embarrass, reject, or punish them for sharing ideas, taking risks, or soliciting feedback"



Conclusions

- Introversion is a personality trait it can't be wished away by trying harder to be more extrovert.
- There is an onus on both the introvert to be stretched an move outside of their comfort zone AND on the mob to accommodate all participants
- Introverts are very able to be productive members of the mob. A little understanding and accommodation from the mob will help them with this greatly.
